Children attended events through the SSP:

Sedgefield Dash

Impact: Increased enjoyment at a range of sports.

After School Clubs:

Outdoor Games Club The club was open to all year groups and each week they chose a different area to focus on. They have completed den building tasks and sporting activities.

Scooter Club This club ran every Thursday for all year groups. Children made obstacle courses and rode scooters around their courses.

Cookery Club every week for children. Children made healthy, budget snacks and meals.

Impact: Children are increasing fitness levels. Taught children links between healthy eating and overall health and fitness.

Coach Support:

Chris from Thrills and Skills worked with children from Year 4 and Year 5 to complete brush craft, den building and survival skills. The children climbed trees using supported ropes.

Impact: Increased fitness levels. Demonstration to children that there are many ways to keep fit. Den building is provided during playtimes in school.

Fit for Life: Classes have started to complete Fit for Life activities (10 minutes each day) using resources from SSP programme.
