Assemblies:



She bought three times as many 10p stamps as 20p stamps.


How many of each stamp did she buy?

Please make sure that you are keeping up to date with the maths work I have set on Conquer Maths; I can access this and check your progress. Remember to keep the Times Tables going on TT Rockstars as well.

English:

Keep using Bugclub (Active Learn), Lexia, Fiction Express and Spelling Shed as this helps with the grammar and spelling elements of the curriculum really well.

This week we will be completing 5 final English tasks before the Summer holidays. They can be split into one task a day or the tasks can be grouped together depending on what works best for your family.

1. **Favourite memory from this year!** – Your first task this week is to think about all of the things we did in Year 3 and choose your favourite memory. Then draw a picture to show this memory (don't forget to add a sentence to say what your favourite memory is!)

2. **Plan a letter to Mrs Wilson** – Think about next year. We are going to write a letter to send to Mrs Wilson and in this task, you will plan what you want to say. You might want to use spider diagrams, a table or bullet points to plan out your letter. Your first paragraph should be all about what you want Mrs Wilson to know about you. Your second paragraph should be about all of the things you are excited for in Year 4. Your final paragraph should include any questions about what you want to know before starting Year 4.

3. **Write your letter to Mrs Wilson** – Don't forget your greeting and sign off. 😊

4. **Plan your 'How to Survive Year 3' guide for the Year 2s** – Now that you have successfully survived moving from the infants to the juniors it is your turn to pass on what you have learned to the Year 2's that will soon be making the same change. In this task you will plan out all of the useful tips and tricks that you have learned for surviving in Year 3! Create a Year 3 spider diagram that includes:

- What are the changes to the school day (e.g. later lunch time, different playtimes and assemblies on Tuesdays and Thursdays, etc...)
- Who will be your best friend in the classroom?
- What do you have to draw in your maths book before anything else?
- How should they behave?
- What did you enjoy most?
- How do you get a pen licence?
- What is good about the Year 3 classroom?
- What are the most interesting lessons you have had/things you have learned?
- And anything else you think is important for the year 2's to know!

5. **Write your 'How to Survive Year 3' guide for the Year 2's** – You can present it in any way you like e.g. a poster, leaflet, book, typed or handwritten, with or without pictures... I can't wait to read them and I will pass them on to Miss Davison to share with the Year 2's 😊

Different levels of support will be needed to complete these activities, so use your judgement on how much support you need to give your child to complete the tasks.

RRSA:

This week Year 3's task focuses on the following right: **Article 23 – A child with a disability has the right to live a full and decent life with dignity, and as far as possible, independence, and to play an active part in their community.**

For this task, find out about a Paralympic sport that interests you and find a way to show your findings in something like a story, poster, PowerPoint or drawing.
