## Communication & Language

- Use longer sentences of four to six words.
- Be able to express a point of view and to debate when they disagree with an adult or a friend, using words as well as actions.
- Can start a conversation with an adult or a friend and continue it for many turns.
- Use talk to organise themselves and their play: "Let's go on a bus... you sit there... I'll be the driver."

## Personal, social & Emotional

### Development

- Help my friends to choose snack or have milk/water.
- Help to wash up the snack pots, to build my sense of responsibility and belonging to the nursery community.
- Help to collect lunch time orders to build my sense of responsibility and belonging to the nursery community.

## Literacy

- Engage in extended conversations about stories, learning new vocabulary
- Use some of their print and letter knowledge in their early writing. For example: writing a pretend shopping list that starts at the top of the page; write 'm' for mummy.
- Write some or all of their name.
- Write some letters accurately.

## Mathematics

- Explore colour and colour mixing
- Say 1 number name for each item 1,2,3,4,5
- Show an awareness of similarities and differences in objects
- Make comparisons between objects relating to shape: this one is flat and this one is

## Expressive Arts & Design

- Remember and sing entire songs.
- Create closed shapes with continuous lines and begin to use these shapes to represent objects.
- Show different emotions in their drawings and paintings like happiness, sadness, fear etc.

## Physical Development

- Use tools in a range of ways to create change, such as rolling pins and cutters. Climbing and balancing activities in the garden to extend their gross motor skills and fine motor skills in their hands (climbing)
- Identify a dominant hand where possible.
- Move items safely, with help from an adult.
